**Archive information and errata:**

- The sample for JAPAN has no respondent identification number (caseid). For this reason the only unique respondent ID for the whole dataset is the serial case ID which was appointed by the data archive (serialid).
- A POPULATION SIZE WEIGHT for the group of the 13 new EU member states as of 2004/2007/2013 (NMS13) was not provided.
- Variable d5a (COMPANY TURNOVER 2011) includes negative values for in total 68 cases (38 cases for Turkey): minimum -2131773824; maximum -94967296. All these cases are coded ‘6’ (“More than 50 million euro”) in variable d5b. 4634 cases are coded ‘9’ in variable d5a, which in accordance with the questionnaire would represent “REFUSAL/DK/NA” answers. In variable d5b all these cases are coded to valid codes ‘1’ to ‘6’.
