Discrimination is understood to mean when a person or group is treated less favourably than others because of personal characteristics.

Harassment is commonly understood to arise when unwanted behaviour takes place with the purpose or effect of violating the dignity of a person and of creating a hostile, degrading, humiliating or offensive environment.

Gender identity refers to each person’s deeply felt internal and individual experience of gender, which may or may not correspond with the sex assigned at birth. Transgender and transsexual are people whose gender identity differs from the sex they were assigned at birth. This has legal implications as well: for example, a transgender or transsexual person with a female gender identity would seek to change her civil documents (passport, ID, driving license, etc.) from "male" to "female" to match how she lives her everyday life.
