II. Survey Details

This Flash Eurobarometer 265 "2009 Lisbon Treaty Referendum Survey" was conducted on behalf of the European Commission Representation in Ireland by Gallup Hungary.

Telephone interviews were conducted in each region of Ireland between the 24 and 28 August 2009 by Gallup UK.

Representativeness of the results

Each regional sample is representative of the population aged 18 years and over. Results were weighted to population marginals in terms of sex, age, region, and economic activity.

Sizes of the sample

1010 interviews were conducted in total.

Ouestionnaires

The questionnaire prepared for this survey is reproduced at the end of this section (see hereafter).

VOLUME C: RESPONDENTS' DEMOGRAPHICS

The VOLUME B presents the results broken down by the following socio-demographic variables:

- Sex (male, female)
- Age (18-24, 25-39, 40-54, 55 +)
- Education (15&-, 16-20, 21&+, still in full time education)
- Subjective urbanisation (metropolitan zone; other town/urban centre; rural zone)
- Occupation (self-employed, employee, manual worker, without a professional activity)
- Prospective vote in the 2009 referendum (yes, no, DK)
- Level of information of EU (extremely well, somewhat, and not informed)

Statistical significance of the results

The results in a survey are valid only between the limits of a statistical margin caused by the sampling process.
