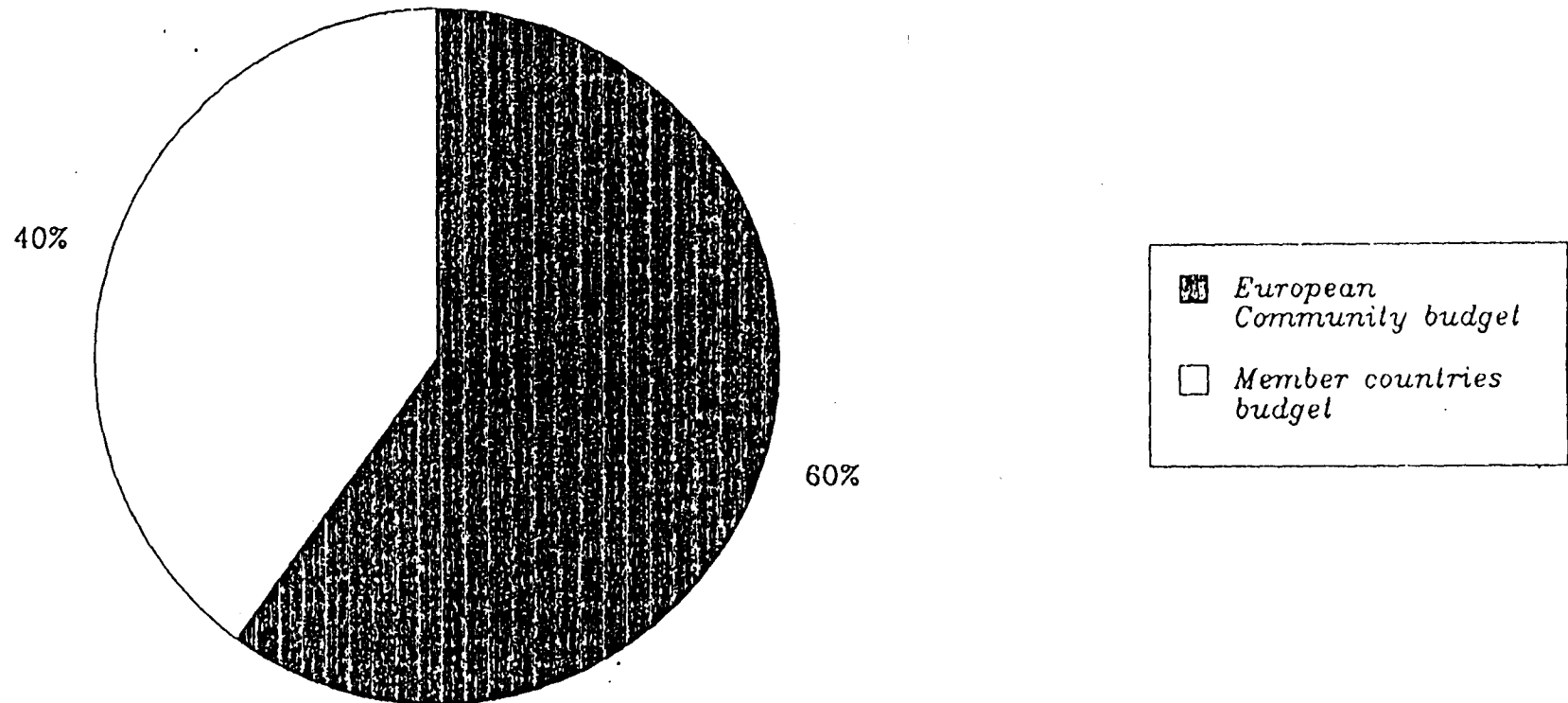

ORIGIN OF PUBLIC EXPENSES IN AGRICULTURAL POLICY

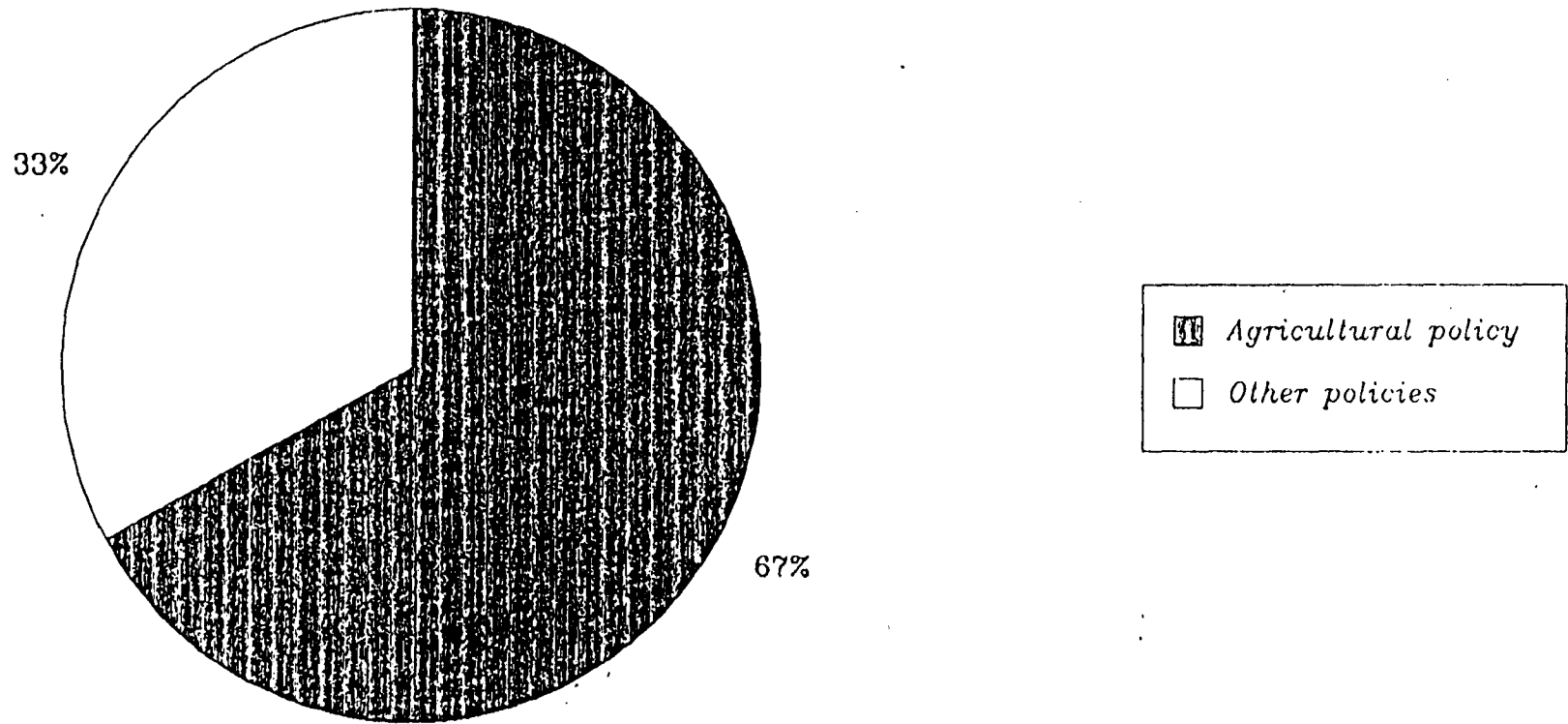

PARTITION OF EUROPEAN COMMUNITY BUDGET

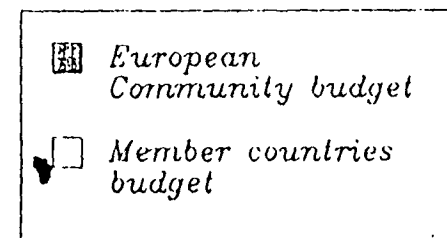
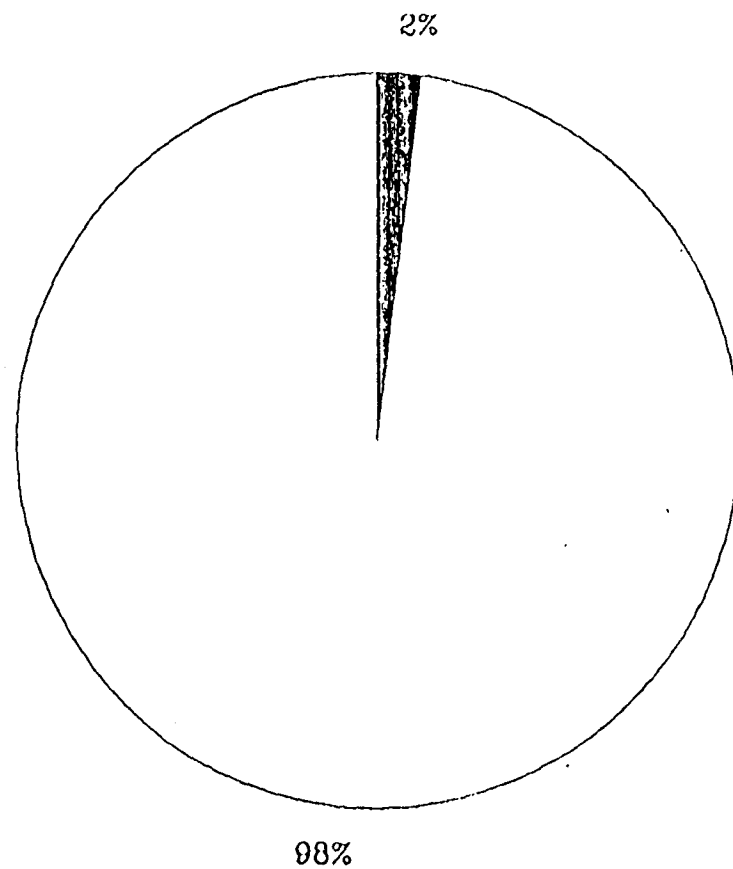
